## U.S. Federal Courts Summer Law Student Externship - Prisoner Litigation (Job Announcement 12-03)



The Office of the Circuit Executive for the United States Courts for the Ninth Circuit is accepting applications for one extern or volunteer law student for our 2012 summer program. This is an unpaid position. Where arrangements can be made with school faculty and administration, credits will be given as part of the law school's clinical study or other academic programs. The student must be able to work up to 15-30 hours per week through the end of summer, but we are flexible as to start and end dates.

**Organization**: The Office of the Circuit Executive provides policy development, administrative, and staff support to: (1) the Ninth Circuit Judicial Council, a governing board of federal judges with jurisdiction over the federal courts of nine western states; (2) the Chief Circuit Judge; (3) the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit; and, (4) as requested, to the federal courts within the Ninth Circuit. The Ninth Circuit, headquartered in San Francisco, is the largest federal circuit in the United States with jurisdiction over nine western states, Guam and the Northern Mariana Islands.

**Duties**: Under the supervision of the Prison Litigation Project Director and/or the OCE Research Attorney for the Self-Represented Litigant Committee, the incumbent will conduct research, prepare legal memoranda, and provide assistance with projects relating to pro se prisoner and non-prisoner cases, court-annexed alternative dispute resolution programs, and conflict resolution training programs.

**<u>Requirements</u>**: The successful candidate will have completed one or two years of law school, have taken one or more courses in research and writing, and be reasonably skilled in the use of the Westlaw computer research system.
