Amici curiae Reporters Committee For Freedom of the Press and 18 media organizations’ unopposed “motion to unseal amicus brief and this motion in cases 13-15957, 13-16731, 13-16732” is granted in part. The unopposed “motion to unseal amicus brief of Google Inc., Facebook, Inc., Microsoft Corporation, and Yahoo Inc.” is also granted in part. This order, the briefs, and Reporters Committee For Freedom of the Press and 18 media organizations’ motion shall be made available to the public only as follows.

The court will provide this order, the Reporters Committee For Freedom of the Press and 18 media organizations' motion to unseal and reply in support of the motion (docket Nos. 40 and 45), the government parties' responses to the motion (docket Nos. 44 and 46), the amicus brief filed by the Reporters Committee For Freedom of the Press and 18 media organizations (docket No. 39) and the amicus brief filed by Google Inc., Facebook, Inc., Microsoft Corporation, and Yahoo Inc. (docket No. 38) to the public in the Cases of Interest section of this court's public website. This order will become effective at noon PDT on May 23, 2014 absent objection by any of the parties.

In the event that the remaining amici curiae file motions to unseal their amicus briefs, the government parties shall inform the court, within 14 days after any such motions have been filed, whether the government parties oppose the motions to unseal.

The briefing schedule established on March 28, 2014 remains in effect.
