Plaintiffs-Intervenors (“Ali Plaintiffs”) have filed a motion for leave to intervene in this appeal. Dkt. 20. Their motion indicates that counsel for the State of Hawaii and Ismail Elshikh take no position on the motion and that counsel for the federal government oppose the motion. Ordinarily, a party filing a response to a motion must do so within 10 days after service of the motion. Fed. R. App.
