22	MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES					
23	During the evidentiary hearing yesterday, June 28, 2021, the Director of the Nevada					
24	Department of Corrections ("NDOC"), Charles Daniels, was asked to provide the expiration					
25	date of the potassium chloride NDOC currently has in stock to complete the lethal injection					
26	required under Nevada law to carry out Plaintiff Zane Floyd's death sentence. The Court					
27	invited counsel for the NDOC Defendants to make a proffer regarding the expiration date;					
28	however, the issue was not resolved during the evidentiary hearing given the fast-moving					

nature of the proceedings. This notice of proffer provides the expiration date of the potassium chloride NDOC currently has in stock: July 31, 2021.¹ Mr. Floyd's counsel is already in possession of the invoice attached in Exhibit B as it was produced on June 17, 2021.

The NDOC Defendants believe the July 31st expiration date of the potassium chloride is highly relevant to the Court's analysis of injunctive relief or a stay.² Specifically, Floyd's execution is currently set for the week of July 26, 2021, the expiration date demonstrates that the NDOC Defendants will suffer actual prejudice under a three-to-fourmonth preliminary injunction and/or stay as NDOC will be deprived of a known drug for use in the lethal injection. NDOC can no longer obtain potassium chloride through the ordinary means by which NDOC purchases medications.³ Because this information is directly pertinent to the Court's consideration of the factors require Floyd must show for injunctive relief or a stay, the NDOC Defendants submit the instant notice of proffer. The NDOC Defendants are willing to make themselves available for a telephonic or video hearing today should the Court believe further inquiry into this issue is necessary.

18	I, Linda Fox, hereby declare based or	n personal	l knowledge and/or information and				
19	belief, that the following assertions are true.						
20	1. I have been a registered pharma	acist with	the State of Nevada since 1990.				
21	2. I have worked as a pharmacist for the Nevada Department of Corrections						
22	(NDOC) since 2004.						
23	3. I currently am the Pharmacy Director for the NDOC, a position I have held						
24	since 2010. This position is also occasionally referred to Chief of Pharmacy or Pharmacy						
25	Director. I am responsible for the administrative and day-to-day functions of						
26	pharmaceutical services for the NDOC. This position requires me to do many things,						
27	including ensuring that medications are ordered, obtained, and properly stored and secured						
28	until they are utilized for their intended use.						

4. Due to sensitive and confidential issues associated with lethal injection, my job duties, under both former Director James Dzurenda and current Director Charles Daniels, has included ordering and purchasing medications that, in the discretion of either Director, would be appropriate for use in any legally scheduled and authorized execution.

5. As part of my duties as Pharmacy Director, I am tasked with ordering each of the drugs using the Cardinal Health ordering portal, as this is the way NDOC ordinarily purchases its medications.

6. In 2019, Former NDOC Director James Dzurenda asked me to purchase potassium chloride, if it was available. I was able to do so through the Cardinal Health order portal in the same manner the NDOC ordinarily purchases its medications. *See* **Exhibit B**, Cardinal Health Invoice.

7. The potassium chloride I purchased pursuant to Director Dzurenda's instruction is still in the possession of the NDOC and will expire on July 31, 2021.

8. In 2021, Director Daniels also authorized me to purchase, if available through the NDOC's ordinary transactional efforts, an additional supply of potassium chloride.

9. However, potassium chloride was no longer an eligible product for the NDOC to purchase on the Cardinal Health order portal.

10. While I take no position as to whether those drugs should be used in the NDOC Protocol, as that is not my decision to make, I can attest that potassium chloride is not readily available for purchase to the NDOC.

11. I declare under penalty of perjury pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746 that the foregoing is true and correct.
