School Calendar (K-12) 2009-2010

Most district schools use a SINGLE-TRACK calendar, with key dates as follows:

- Fall SemesterSept. 9, 2009 through Feb. 5, 2010
- Spring Semester.....Feb. 8, 2010 through June 24, 2010
- Winter Recess.....Dec. 21, 2009 through Jan. 8, 2010
- Spring RecessMarch 29, 2010 through April 2, 2010

More than 141 schools use one of two different year-round calendars – either three-track or four-track – to accommodate heavy enrollment at those sites. Year-round calendars begin in early July. Students attend classes and have vacation time on staggered tracks throughout the year.

Start: July 1, 2009 Tracks B & C **End:** April 29, 2010 Track C
 August 31, 2009 Track A June 30, 2010 Tracks A & B

Four-Track (90-30)

Start: July 6, 2009 Tracks B, C & D **End:** May 6, 2010 Track D
 August 18, 2009 Track A June 30, 2010 Tracks A, B, C

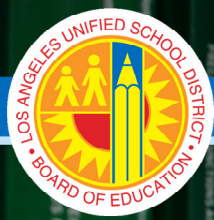
