GET STARTED NOW!

Some compound words (like bus rapid transit, dog whistle, or identity theft) don't appear on the drop-down list when you enter them into the search window. If a compound term doesn't appear in the dropdown list, try entering the term into the search window and then hit the search button (instead of the "enter" key).

- 1. A fastening, as for a door or gate, typically consisting of a bar that fits into a notch or slot and is lifted from either side by a lever or string.
- **2.** A spring lock, as for a door, that is opened from the outside by a key.

v. latched, latch-ing, latch-es

To close or lock with a latch.

v.intr.

- 1. To have or be closed with a latch.
- **2.** To shut tightly so that the latch is engaged: a door too warped to latch.
