Jesusa G. Curva appeals from the district court's order granting summary judgment to the defendants. We review de novo the district court's determination regarding jurisdiction. *Robinson v. United States*, 586 F.3d 683, 685 (9th Cir. 2009).

The district court lacked jurisdiction over this action. The United States

Citizenship and Immigration Services' denial of Curva's application to adjust

status is nonfinal, and she has not exhausted her administrative remedies. *See*Cabaccang v. U.S. Citizenship & Immigration Servs., 627 F.3d 1313, 1316-18 (9th

Cir. 2010). We therefore vacate the district court's order of January 11, 2010, and

remand with instructions to dismiss the action for lack of jurisdiction.
