Complainant alleges that three circuit judges, a district judge and a magistrate judge made improper rulings in his cases. These allegations relate directly to the merits and must therefore be dismissed. See 28 U.S.C.

§ 352(b)(1)(A)(ii); In re Charge of Judicial Misconduct, 685 F.2d 1226, 1227 (9th Cir. Jud. Council 1982); Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(B).

Complainant also alleges the judges are biased against him as a pro se prisoner litigant. But adverse rulings aren't proof of bias, and complainant hasn't offered any other evidence of misconduct, so this charge also must be dismissed.

See In re Complaint of Judicial Misconduct, 583 F.3d 598, 598 (9th Cir. 2009); see also 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii); Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(D).
