ORDER

THOMAS, Chief Judge:

Complainant alleges that a district judge violated his constitutional rights by dismissing his civil cases. These allegations relate directly to the merits of the judge's rulings and must therefore be dismissed. See 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii); In re Charge of Judicial Misconduct, 685 F.2d 1226, 1227 (9th Cir. Jud. Council 1982); Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(B).

Complainant also alleges that the judge was racially biased against him. Adverse rulings are not proof of bias, see In re Complaint of Judicial Misconduct, 583 F.3d 598, 598 (9th Cir. 2009), and complainant provides no objectively verifiable proof (for example, names of witnesses, recorded documents or transcripts) to support his allegations. See In re Complaint of Judicial Misconduct, 569 F.3d 1093, 1093 (9th Cir. 2009). Without such evidence, this charge must be dismissed as unfounded. See 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii); Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(D).

Complainant's request for a hearing on his complaint of judicial misconduct

is denied.
