**ORDER**

**THOMAS**, Chief Judge:

A pro se prisoner alleges that a magistrate judge was biased due to complainant's race and disability. Adverse rulings are not evidence of bias, see In re Complaint of Judicial Misconduct, 631 F.3d 961, 963 (9th Cir. Jud. Council 2011), and complainant provides no other evidence to support these allegations, which must be dismissed as unsupported. See 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii); In re Complaint of Judicial Misconduct, 569 F.3d 1093 (9th Cir. Jud. Council 2009); Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(D). Any disagreement complainant has with the judge's rulings is merits-related and not cognizable in misconduct proceedings. See 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii); Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(B).

**DISMISSED.**
