ORDER

THOMAS, Chief Judge:

Complainant, a pro se prisoner, has filed a misconduct complaint naming two district judges and two magistrate judges, but does not make any specific allegations against any of the subject judges. Instead, complainant alleges only that the Clerk of Court has refused to file his notice of appeal. This allegation is dismissed because this misconduct complaint procedure applies only to federal judges. See In re Complaint of Judicial Misconduct, 632 F.3d 1287, 1288 (9th Cir. Jud. Council 2011); Judicial-Conduct Rule 4. Moreover, a review of the underlying record shows that no final order has been entered, and the case remains pending.

To the extent complainant alleges that any of the subject judges were involved in rejecting his notices of appeal, complainant offers no proof in support of such allegations, which are dismissed as unfounded. See 28 U.S.C.

§ 352(b)(1)(A)(iii); In re Complaint of Judicial Misconduct, 552 F.3d 1146, 1147

(9th Cir. Jud. Council 2009); Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(D).
