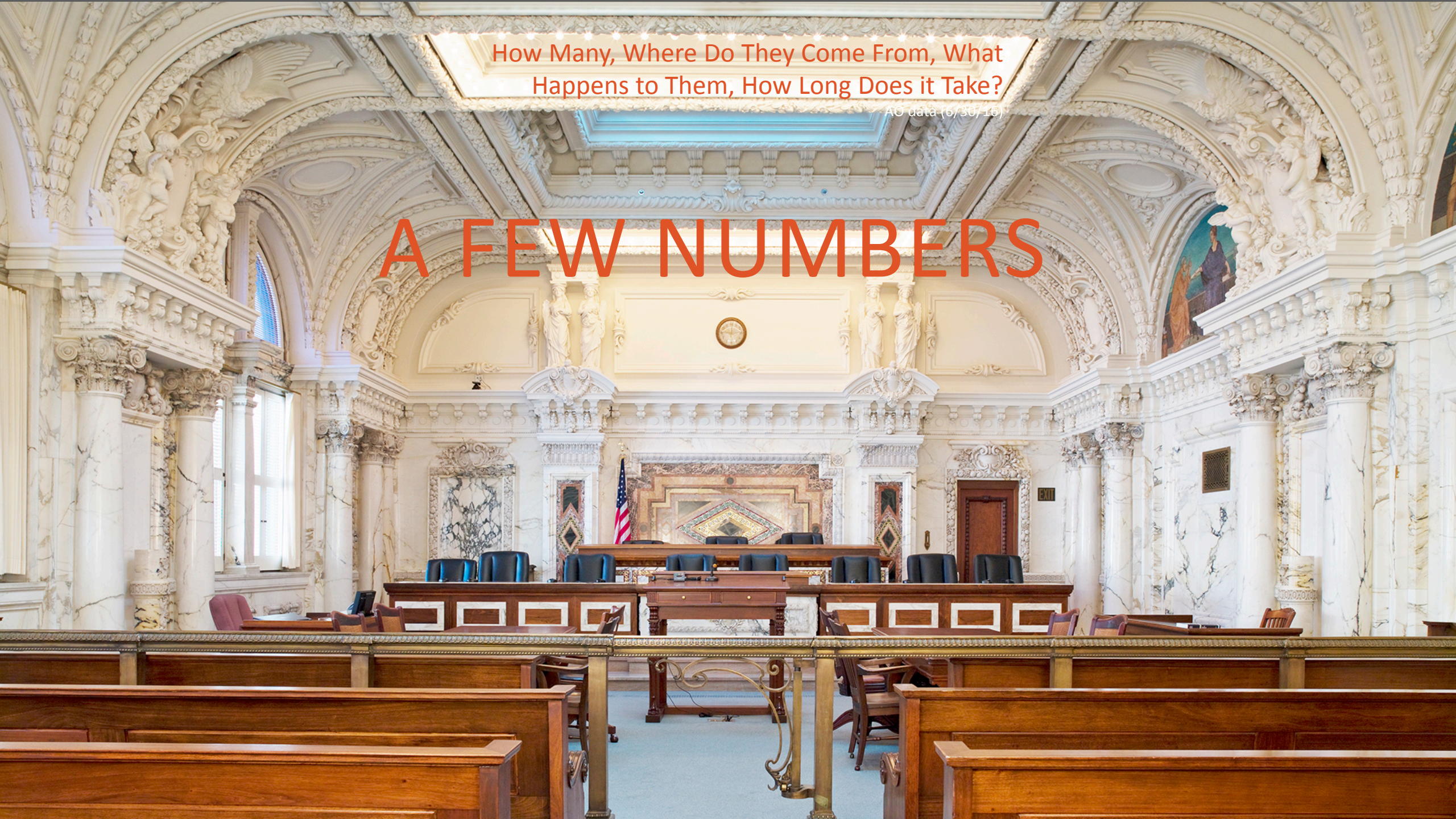

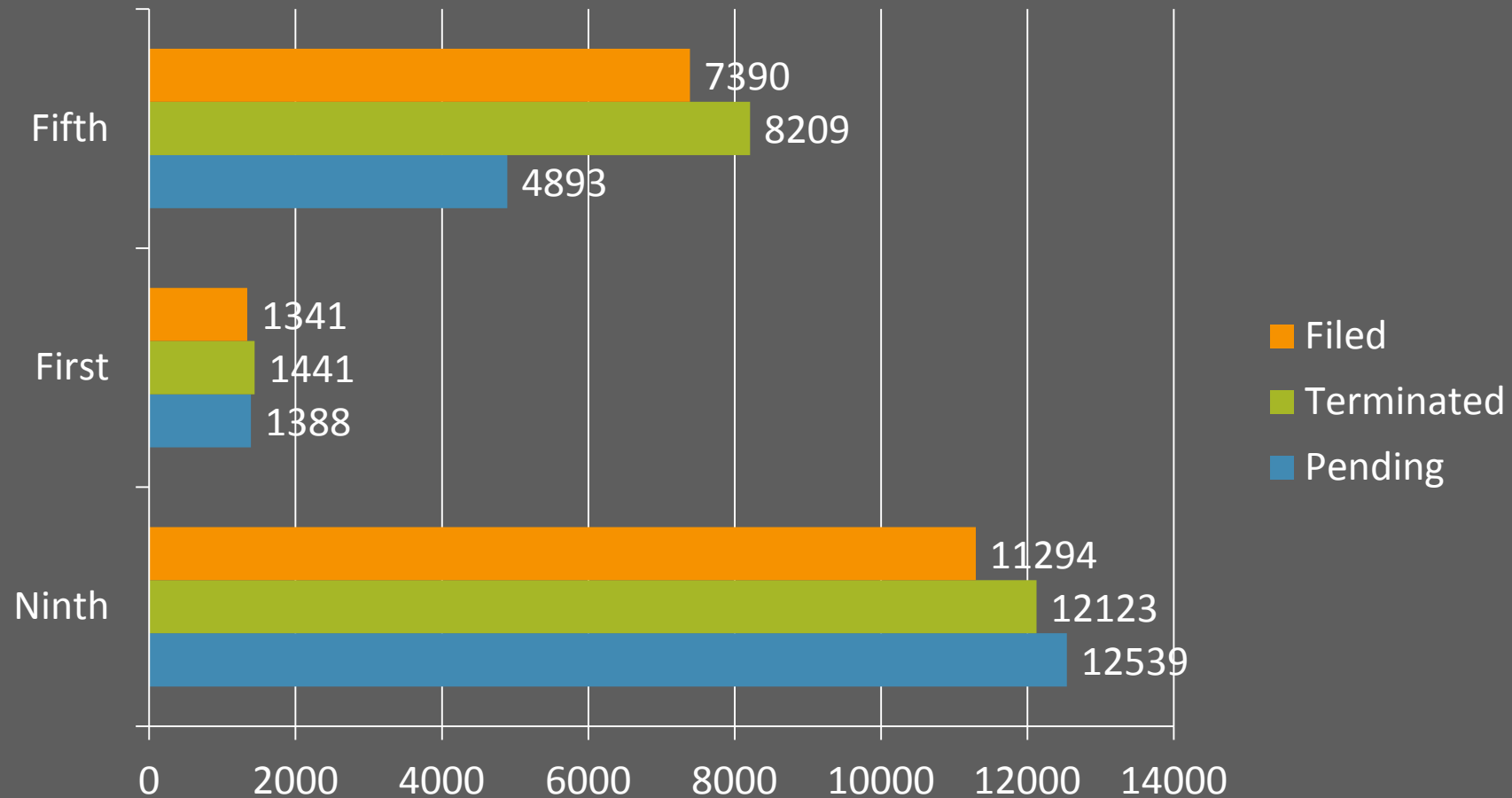

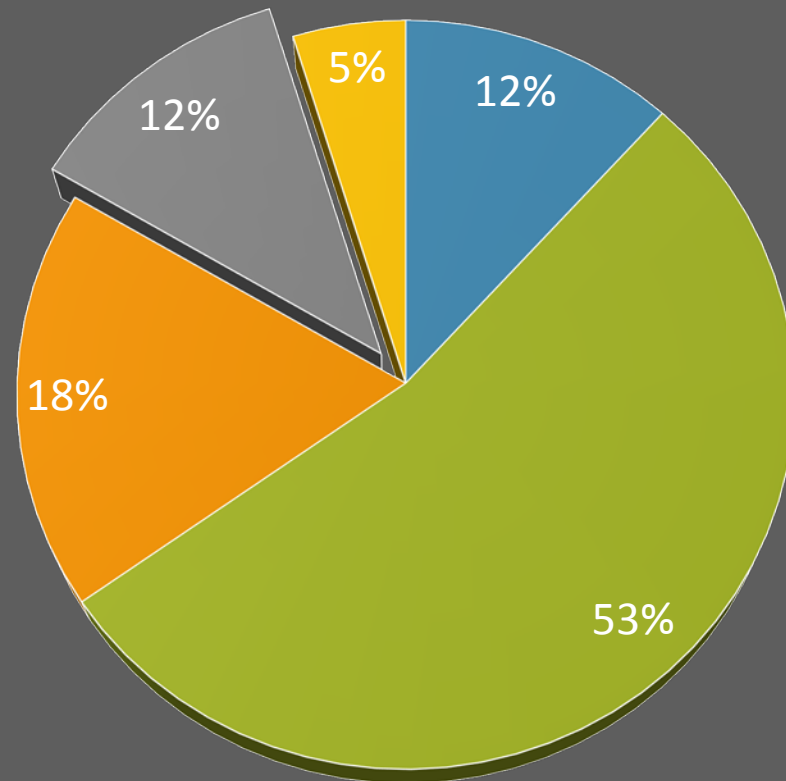

AS OF SEPTEMBER 19, 2017

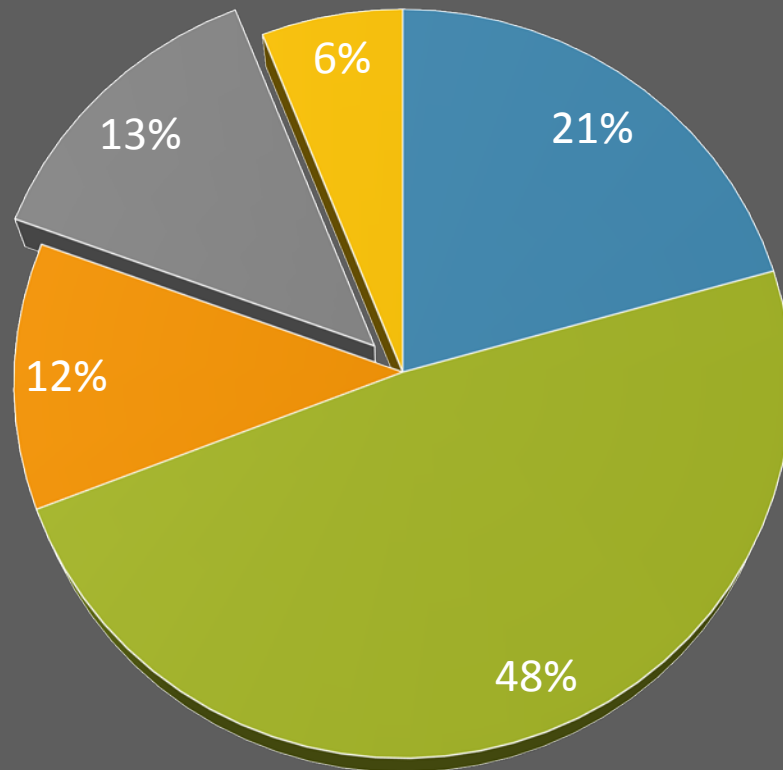

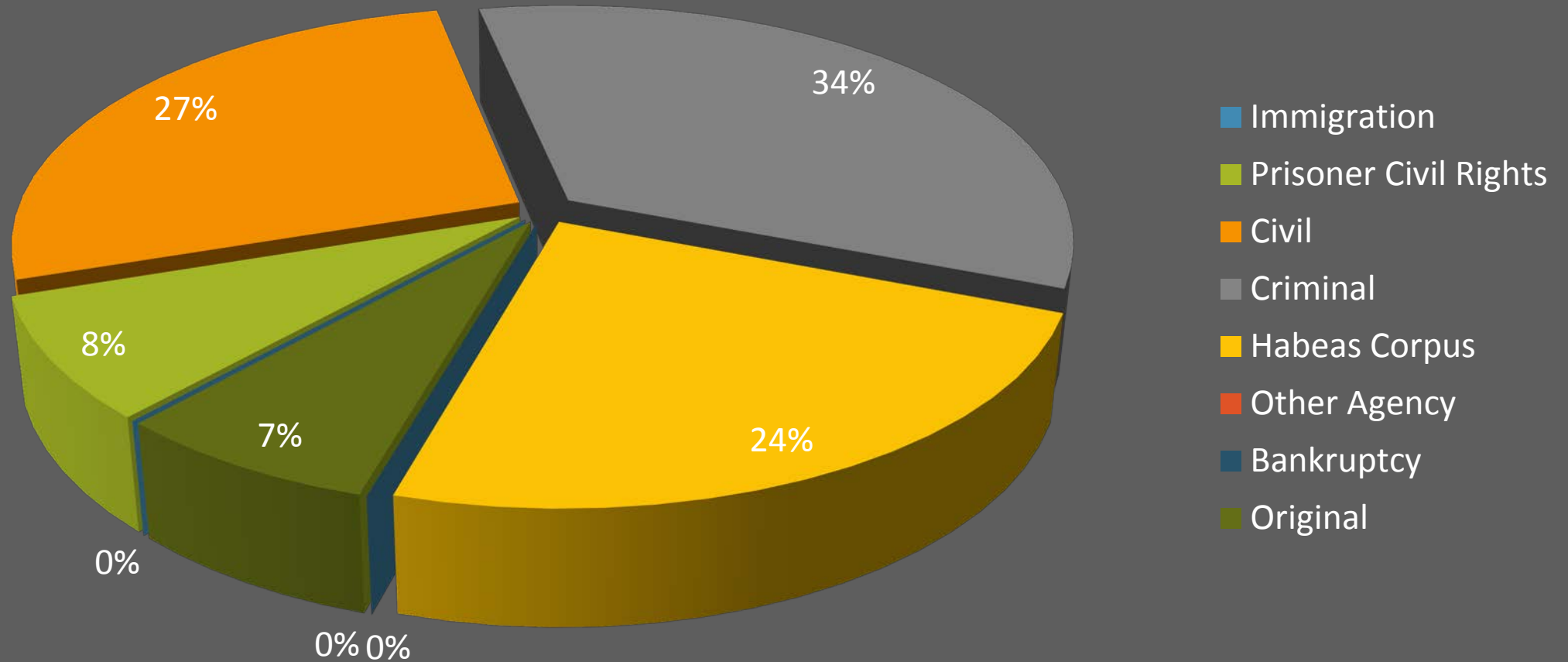

FOR THE 12 MONTHS ENDING 6/30/17



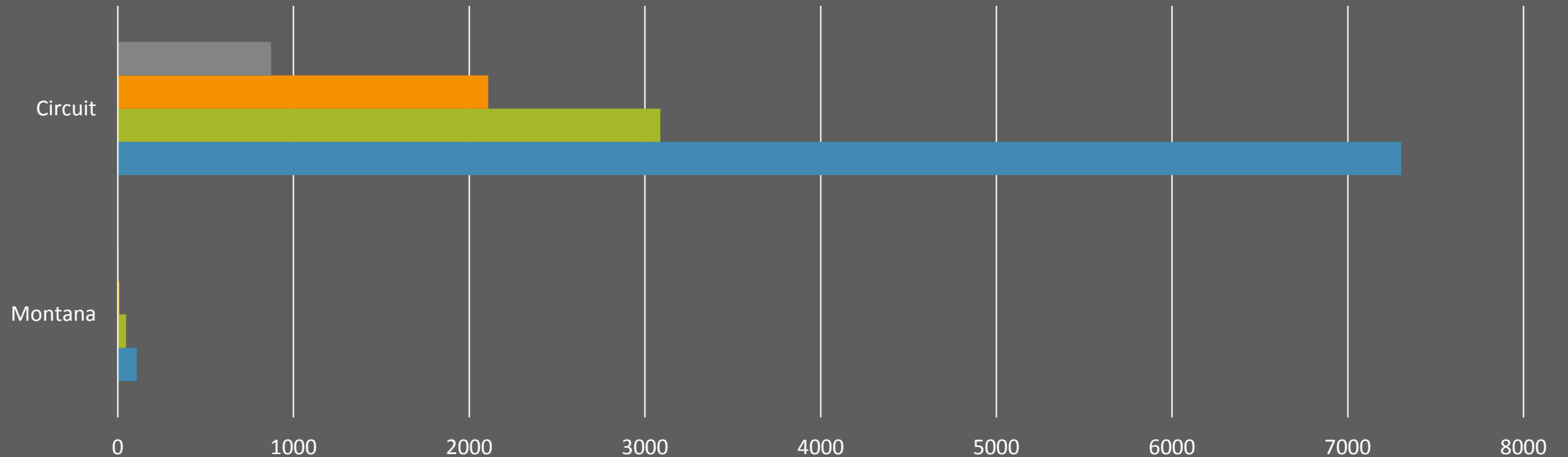

# INITIAL REVIEW OF NEW CASES

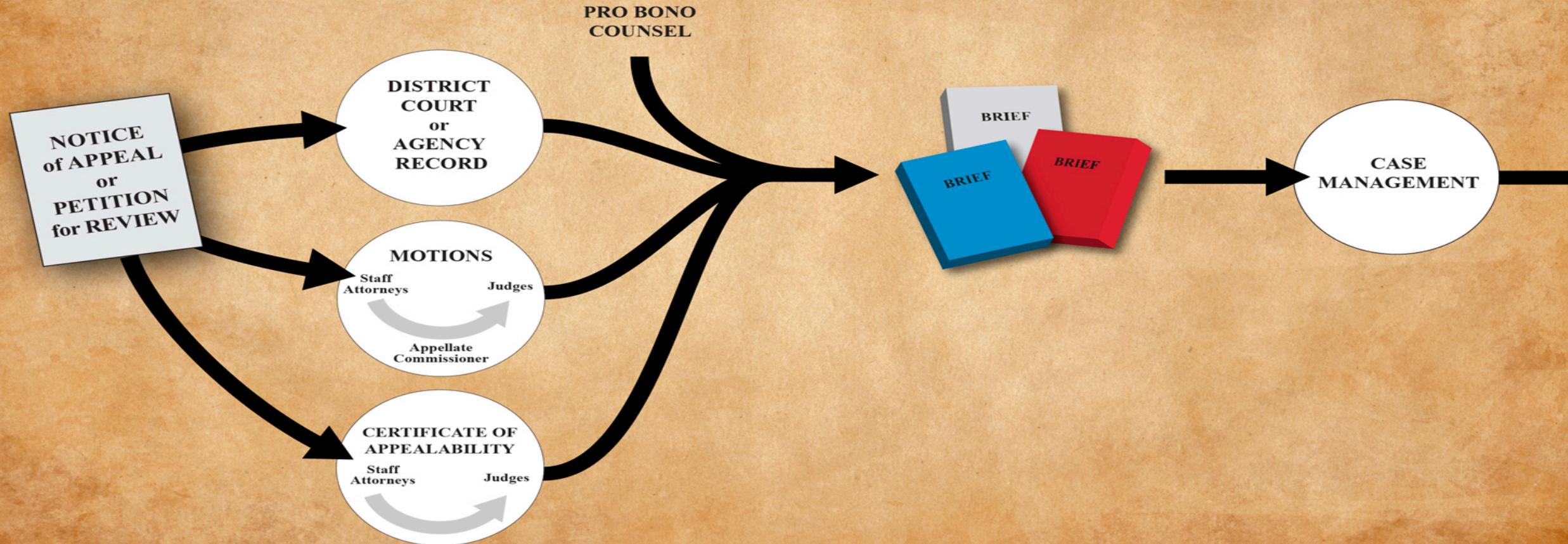
- All new appeals and petitions for review are referred to staff attorneys' office
- Jurisdictional review and case management issues – fees, attorneys
- Certificates of Appealability
- Original proceedings (mandamus, SOS)
- Permissive Appeals
- Orders to show cause

- Calendaring process/assignment to merits panel

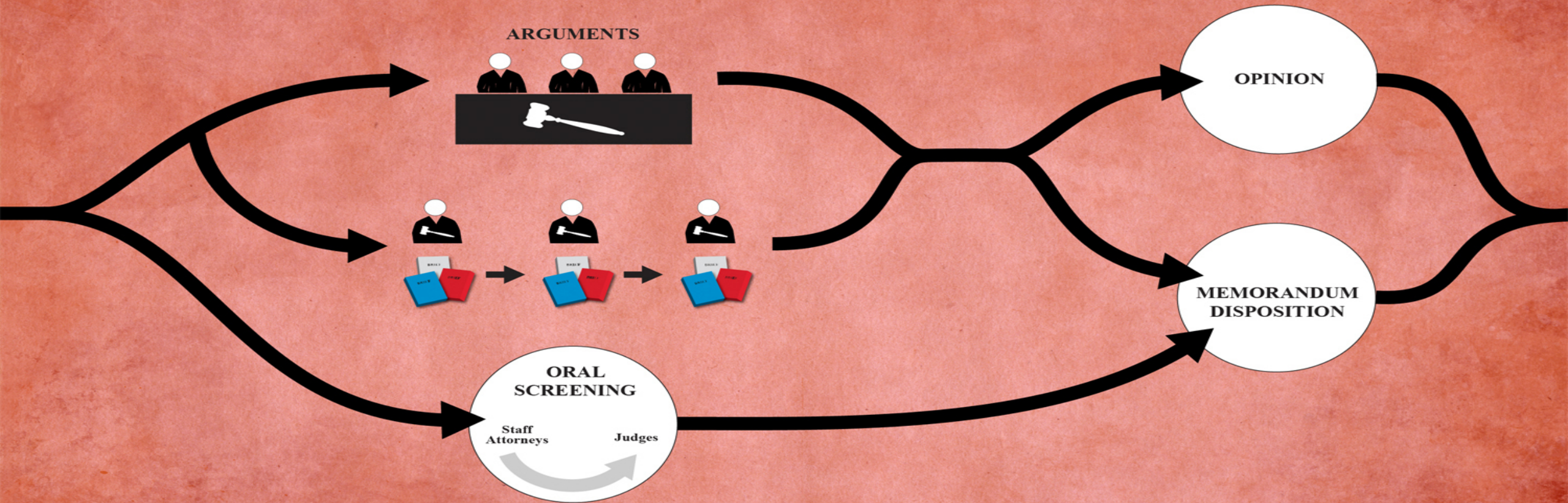

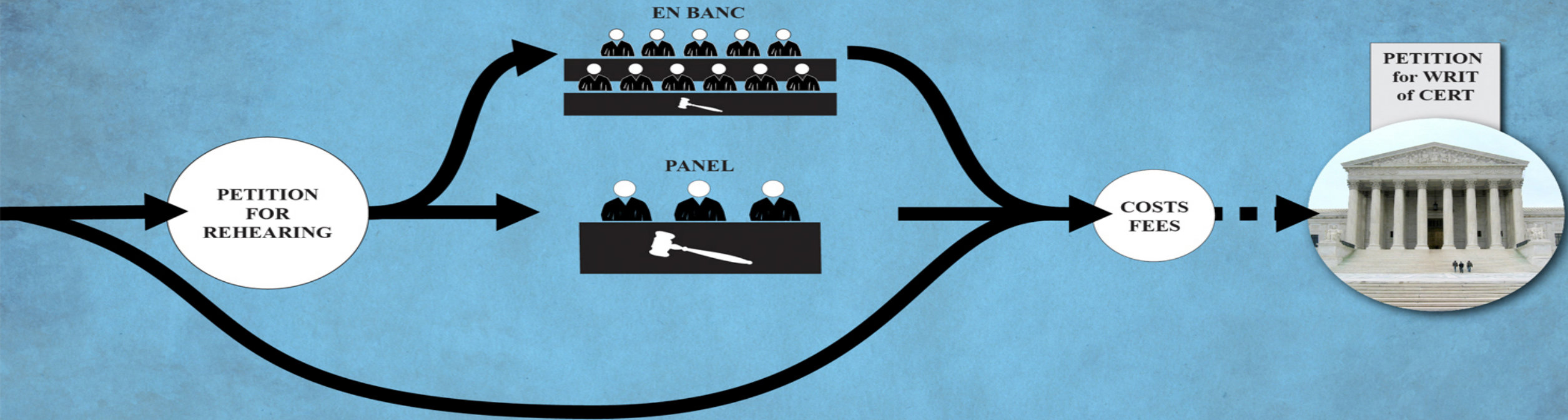

# SEALED FILINGS

- Interim Rule 27-13 – presumption has changed and all must now be electronically filed
- Difference between Sealed documents and Sealed cases
- Sealed vs Ex Parte vs Classified vs Restricted
- Access to Sealed and Ex Parte documents on CM and PACER
- Motions and notices of sealing/unsealing per Interim Rule
- Certificate of service
- Use of pseudonyms



# OTHER CIRCUIT AND FRAP RULE CHANGES IN 2016 AND 2017

- Archived rule changes (and pending when any) are available in redline version at [http://www.ca9.uscourts.gov/content/view.php?pk\\_id=0000000682](http://www.ca9.uscourts.gov/content/view.php?pk_id=0000000682)
- July 2016 amendments – Oversized briefs, SOS petitions, reconsideration motions
- December 2016 amendments – previous word limits for briefs are now in circuit rules, opting out of new FRAP shorter limits, also keeping page option for motions and petitions (with conversion formula), change of effective dates
- June 2017 – elimination of 3 day service rule, expansion of reply brief deadlines
- Coming Up – new excerpts process and rules, revisions to 22 habeas rules, permanent sealing rule. FRAP Dec 2018 rules re mandates. Nothing for Dec 2017.

# CM/ECF TIPS AND COMMON ERRORS

- Filing original proceedings and petitions for review electronically
- Filing briefs and motions – use generic events
- Descriptions of briefs and excerpts and related documents
- Filing sealed documents – service and timing and basis
- Help Guide is very useful and informative
- Updating Pacer account and email
- Physical and documentary trial exhibits – submit by separate motion
