**ORDER****KOZINSKI**, Chief Judge:

Complainant, a pro se prisoner, alleges that the magistrate judge referred to his habeas case improperly denied his request for an extension of time. This charge relates directly to the merits of the judge's rulings and must therefore be dismissed. See 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii); Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(B); In re Charge of Judicial Misconduct, 685 F.2d 1226, 1227 (9th Cir. Jud. Council 1982).

Complainant also obliquely suggests that the judge was discourteous and biased against him. But complainant never explains how the judge demonstrated his supposed bias and hasn't provided any objectively verifiable proof of bias or improper behavior. See In re Complaint of Judicial Misconduct, 569 F.3d 1093, 1093 (9th Cir. Jud. Council 2009). Because there is no evidence of misconduct, these charges must be dismissed. See 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii); Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(D).

**DISMISSED.**
