ORDER

SCHROEDER, Circuit Judge¹:

Complainant, a pro se litigant, alleges that a district judge, a magistrate judge and three circuit judges improperly exercised jurisdiction over his case and made various improper rulings. These charges relate directly to the merits of the judges' rulings and must therefore be dismissed. See 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii); Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(B); In re Charge of Judicial Misconduct, 685 F.2d 1226, 1227 (9th Cir. Jud. Council 1982).

Complainant further alleges that the judges were not impartial and favored the defendants. Adverse rulings alone do not prove complainant's charges. See In re Complaint of Judicial Misconduct, 583 F.3d 598, 598 (9th Cir. 2009). Because complainant hasn't provided any other objectively verifiable proof to support his allegations, there isn't sufficient evidence that misconduct occurred. See 28 U.S.C.
