ORDER

KOZINSKI, Chief Judge:

A pro se litigant alleges that a judge improperly handled his case, and should not have transferred it to another district. These charges relate directly to the merits of the judge's rulings and must be dismissed. <u>See</u> 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii); Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(B); <u>In re Charge of Judicial</u> <u>Misconduct</u>, 685 F.2d 1226, 1227 (9th Cir. Jud. Council 1982).

Any charges of misconduct against a court clerk must be dismissed because the misconduct proceedings apply only to judges. <u>See</u> Judicial-Conduct Rule 4.

Complainant further alleges that an out-of-circuit judge violated a federal rule, although there's no indication that judge was involved in complainant's case. The Judicial Council has no jurisdiction over judges outside the circuit. <u>See</u> Judicial-Conduct Rule 7(a). The charge must therefore be dismissed. <u>See</u> Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(F).
