**ORDER**

**KOZINSKI**, Chief Judge:

A pro se litigant submitted a complaint against a district judge that includes an inadequate statement of facts. “Under our rules, a judicial misconduct complaint ‘must contain a concise statement that details the specific facts on which the claim of misconduct or disability is based,’” In re Complaint of Judicial Misconduct, 630 F.3d 968, 968–69 (9th Cir. Jud. Council 2010) (quoting Judicial-Conduct Rule 6(b)), and a complainant may not circumvent the “requirement of a brief statement of facts by referencing other materials,” In re Complaint of Judicial Misconduct, 632 F.3d 1287, 1287–88 (9th Cir. Jud. Council 2011). Because complainant’s purported statement of facts doesn’t include a concise statement detailing his allegations of misconduct, the complaint is dismissed. See 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(i).

**DISMISSED.**
