**ORDER**

**THOMAS**, Chief Judge:

Complainant, a pro se litigant, alleges that a district judge improperly dismissed his case and erred in rejecting some of complainant's filings. These allegations relate directly to the merits of the judge's rulings and are therefore dismissed. See 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii); In re Charge of Judicial Misconduct, 685 F.2d 1226, 1227 (9th Cir. Jud. Council 1982); Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(B).

Complainant further alleges that the judge was biased against him because of his disability and has an "innate hatred of poor and indigent people" who cannot hire counsel. Complainant also claims that the judge favored defendants and possibly has "a relationship" with the defendants' law firm. But adverse rulings alone are not proof of bias, and complainant provides no other objectively verifiable evidence to support these allegations, so they must also be dismissed. See In re Complaint of Judicial Misconduct, 583 F.3d 598 (9th Cir. Jud. Council

2009); Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(D); see also 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii).

**DISMISSED.**
