ORDER

THOMAS, Chief Judge:

Complainant alleges that a district judge and a magistrate judge were biased against him in resolving a preliminary motion in a civil case. Adverse rulings cannot alone prove bias. See In re Complaint of Judicial Misconduct, 583 F.3d 598, 598 (9th Cir. Jud. Council 2009). Because complainant offers no other evidence to support his claims, these charges are dismissed. See 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii); Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(D).

Complainant further alleges that the judges ignored the allegations of deprivation of constitutional rights set forth in his motion and complaint. This allegation relates directly to the merits of the judges' rulings and must therefore be dismissed. See 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii); In re Charge of Judicial Misconduct, 685 F.2d 1226, 1227 (9th Cir. Jud. Council 1982); Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(B).
