ORDER

THOMAS, Chief Judge:

Complainant alleges that a magistrate judge was biased against her as a prose litigant. However, adverse rulings alone are not proof of bias, and complainant provides no objectively verifiable evidence to support this allegation, which must be dismissed. See 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii); In re Complaint of Judicial Misconduct, 583 F.3d 598 (9th Cir. Jud. Council 2009); Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(D).

Complainant further alleges that the judge delayed her cases, but offers no evidence that the alleged delay was based on improper motive, or that the judge has habitually delayed ruling in a significant number of unrelated cases.

Accordingly, this allegation must be dismissed. See In re Complaint of Judicial Misconduct, 584 F.3d 1230, 1231 (9th Cir. Jud. Council 2009); Judicial-Conduct Rule 3(h)(3)(B).
